St. Euphrosynos was born into a poor family and didn't receive a formal education.

However, he was devoted to Christ, even from a young age.

As an adult, he became a cook and later a monk. As a monastic, he worked as a cook preparing food at the monastary. The monks would often ridicule him and make fun of him, but he always endured with humility and Christian patience.

In the same monastary there was a devout priest who prayed that he might see a glimpse into the paradise prepared for those who love God. One night, as he was sleeping, he found himself in a beautiful garden, and in it he saw St. Euphrosynos, the cook, standing in the garden. St. Euphrosynos told him "This garden is reserved for God's elect, and by His great goodness, I also dwell here." The priest

pointing to some apples, inquired if he might have some of them. Taking a few of the apples, St. Euphrosynos placed them in the priest's outer garment saying, "Receive that which you requested, and may you delight in them."

Upon waking, he had the three apples from paradise which were then cut up and distributed. They emitted a sweet, heavenly fragrance. When St. Euphrosynos was approached about his time in paradise, he humbly avoided conversing about it, and even left the monastery, avoiding any vain glory.

#### **Basil and Elevation** of the Holy Cross

The Elevation of the Cross, or Exaltation of the Holy Cross, is a major feast day in the Orthodox Church celebrated on September 14, commemorating the finding of the True Cross by Saint Helen under a patch of basil plants.

### Three Baked Apples of Paradise



#### Ingredients

3 TBSP unsalted butter, softened 1/4 C packed brown sugar

1/2 tsp cinnamon 1/8 tsp nutmea

old-fashioned rolled oats 1/4 C

3 large apples

#### **Directions:**

- Preheat your oven to 375 degrees (F)
- Prepare your 10 inch baking pan by lining the bottom with parchment paper and greasing the sided with cooking spary or olive oil.
- In a medium size bowl, combine all ingredients.
- Place cored apples in a pie dish.
- Spoon filling into each apple, filling all the way to the top.
- Pour warm water into the dish around the apples.
- Bake for 40-45 minutes or until apples appear slightly soft.
